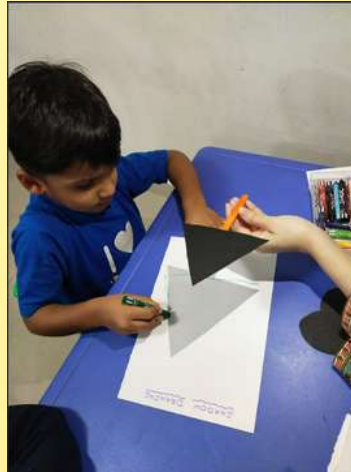

# PRIMARY PANACHE

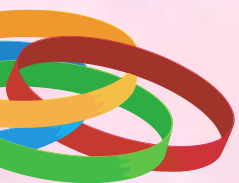

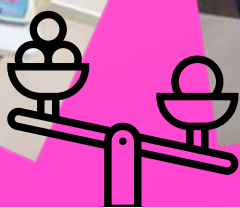




# Meritorious Middle School

## TOK EXHIBITION EPISTEMOLOGIA 2023

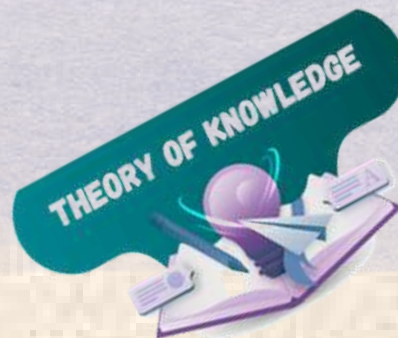

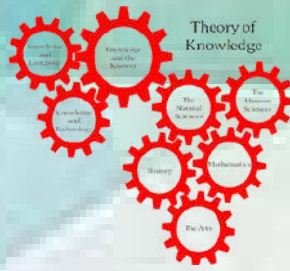
